

ASSOCIATIONS, CLUBS, FOUNDATIONS AND SOCIETIES

Mirrors of the interests, concerns and issues of the times, the voluntary associations of clubs and organizations provide a glimpse into the history of our community. From the suffragettes and temperance groups of the past to the peace groups and women's role groups of the present, these associations of people sharing common interests and goals provide a changing view of the dominant issues and ideas of the time. The rise and fall of some clubs and the continuance of others reflect the growth of the community. The Newton Free Library's section on clubs and organizations offers a colorful and often revealing look into our past and an insight, on a community level, into a fact of American life much commented on by historians: the flourishing of clubs, organizations and societies in the nineteenth century.

An extensive assortment of Newton's older associations' minutes, papers and records is maintained in the Newton Collection. Two such clubs in the collection, the Reading Club, formed in 1879 and the Social Science Club, organized in 1886, are still active in the 21st Century. The Every Saturday Club, formed in 1870, with librarian Melvil Dewey as one of its founding members became inactive around 2001.

Hunnewell Club (formerly Hunnewell Hill Club of 1895) was established by Freelan O. Stanley in 1897 as a social and reading place in a 3-story building at 84 Eldredge Street at the corner of Church Street and is still standing today. Members were only admitted from the Newton Corner area, and men living farther than 4 miles from the clubhouse and all women were allowed only restricted use. Activities of the club included pool, billiards, bowling, cards, concerts, theatricals, receptions, and parties. Later the club let community organizations use its space for meetings, a dancing school, a kindergarten, and a temporary church sanctuary. The property was sold to the Pomroy Foundation in 1967, but the club kept ownership of the bowling alleys. This collection includes photographs of the interior and exterior of the clubhouse, the actors on opening night of a play performed in April, 1898, a caricature of 5 club members, and text of 2 brief histories of the club.

A letter from the president of the Madonna Del Carmine Society says, "When our forefathers came to this country they brought with them many strong and cherished traditions. They wanted to pass these on to their children and their children's children. This is how The Madonna Del Carmine Society was founded in 1935." One of these traditions is of the adoration to Our Lady of Mount Carmel. A flyer prepared for contributions indicates that "money raised from various functions is donated to the Church as well as to numerous organizations in need." Organized by and for Newton's Italian community primarily based in the village of Nonantum, the "Festa" parades and programs were planned in and around Hawthorne [sic] Playground, later known as Hawthorn Park. Held annually in mid-July, more recent publicity shows the dates for the 76th annual festival to be July 13-17, 2011 at Pellegrini Park (formerly known as Hawthorn Park) in Nonantum.

St. Mary of Carmen Society. St. Mary of Carmen Society officers for 2011 (p.3): Anthony C. Gentile, Sr., President; Charles Proia, Festival Chairman, and others. From the President Gentile's closing statement in his anniversary letter, "This 76th Festa is dedicated to all the deceased members of the Society whose work and dedication helped keep this beautiful tradition alive."

Contents contain three facsimiles of early documents of the Society: a 1937 application in Italian for admission to the Society: "Domanda D'Ammissione, Soc. di Maria Santissima del Carmine, Loggia No. 1 (p.18); a flyer for the Carnival Concert with the Napoli Band, July 13-16, 1967 (p.21); a newspaper advertisement for the Second Annual Celebration in Honor of Maria SS. Del Carmine, July 18-20, 1936 (p. 56). The book is primarily comprised of advertisements from merchants, anniversary wishes, memorial tributes, contemporary and historic photo reproductions, a letter of welcome from the president of the Society, and lists of officers and other positions, such as the Sick Committee and the Scholarship Committee.
